EDUCATION STRATEGY

Aim: The aim of the Education Strategy is to ensure that all students look back on their time at Pangbourne College as a period of joy and growth. Taking delight in the friendships they have formed and appreciating the experiences they had; knowing they were supported and challenged to become the best version of themselves and live life to the full.

Academic Rigour not Academic Selection to help every individual realise their ambition



How this will be measured

- GCSE Value Added score of +1 so that every student secures, on average, one grade higher than their baseline target across each of 9 GCSEs. Thus demonstrating significant additional value to students and families.
- A Level Value Added score of +0.75 placing the College significantly above the average for the Independent Sector and securing strong destinations for students.
- **BTEC** average grade of Distinction placing the College in the top 5% of schools nationally and ensuring the BTEC pathway is a route to top universities and employment.
- Relevant vocational offer to stay abreast of changes to the labour market and ensure our students remain competitive and ahead of the curve.
- **Student destinations** securing 100% Top Third University destinations or Top 100 apprenticeships, including degree apprenticeships, so that each individual student secures their destination of choice that best fits their dreams and ambitions.
- Teacher recruitment utilising both the site and the development offer to attract highly qualified teachers into the College. Situating Pangbourne as the leading Independent School for teacher development and expertise through our partnerships and in-house coaching programmes.
- Teacher development and coaching securing partnerships with leading teacher educators like Steplab to ensure our staff have a clear development pathway against the Pangbourne College teacher standards. Thus every teacher develops every year and no student falls between the cracks.
- Partnerships with excellent models within both the maintained and independent sector to ensure Pangbourne College is not an island but has access to the latest thinking around curriculum, assessment and pedagogy.







Element

Exploration & Adventure, increasing self-awareness and promoting resilience

How this will be measured

- Adventure Learning curriculum a sequenced adventure learning curriculum from Year 7 through to Upper Sixth Form ensures every Pangbourne student experiences a core programme that enables them to experience challenge and risk in a controlled environment and face novel situations. that require new ways of thinking and working together.
- Combined Cadet Force (CCF) and Duke of Edinburgh's **Award** – all students complete the Bronze and Silver elements of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award programme, with at least 25% of Lower Sixth Form securing Gold. All students complete a minimum of 12 months in the CCF.
- **High and low ropes courses** utilised both for the activities programme and the adventure learning curriculum to develop problem-solving and team work.
- Mountain bike course utilised through the activities programme and maximises use of the College site to enhance the adventurous element of Pangbourne.
- Admissions selection an admissions process based on the adventure elements of Pangbourne College education to ensure students that join the College have a spirit of adventure and an enjoyment of new experiences.
- **Expeditions** expanding the expeditions element of the adventure programme to enable students to participate in challenges in a high mountain environment alongside community development work in Africa.

Element	How this will be measured
Community, a supportive ecosystem with exceptional pastoral care	Pastoral care – maintaining and enhancing the structures to ensure every student is known as an individual and has a trusted adult at College that they can turn to when needed.
	Boarding – ensuring that the boarding model offers the best experience to students through developing a sense of collegiality and camaraderie whilst offering best value for money to families.
	Tutor programme – having a structured tutoring programme where every parent receives bespoke feedback on how their child is doing and what they need to do next.
	Mentoring – utilising the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Programme to enable all students to both have a mentor, and become a mentor. Using a recognised training programme to ensure all mentors are appropriately trained and supported.
	Ceremony – ensuring that the ceremonial traditions of the College generate a sense of belonging and shared identity.

Leadership and personal growth



How this will be measured

- Traditions maintaining the core values and ceremonial traditions of the College to fully leverage the leadership and development opportunities these present.
- Taking responsibility enhancing the current Taking Responsibility programme in order that all year groups have a leadership development pathway. This is connected to both the academic and adventure curriculums to enhance student interests and develop new strengths.
- Volunteering and community work utilising the structures
 of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award to enable all students to
 participate in volunteering work that gives back to the wider
 community and that enables them to work with other young
 people from different backgrounds and experiences. Thus
 helping prepare our students for life after Pangbourne.
- Work experience ensuring that all Lower Sixth Form students participate in a meaningful programme of work experience so they both understand the value of hard work and have explored potential pathways into work.
- Sport ensuring all students participate fully in the sporting programmes and experience the joy of both individual and team pursuits.
- Sporting excellence as a result of a clear sport development and talent pathway, Pangbourne College performance sports are recognised at a national level without recourse to Sixth Form scholarships and bursaries. Using the sports programmes to enable access to elite international universities
- Flourishing through the use of Unifrog (or similar platform), all Pangbourne College students can journey through a sequenced careers guidance curriculum and have a repository for cataloguing all of the above; to both ensure every student has a clear goal and dream and knows the steps needed to secure it.
